Three leading sources of buildings and grounds in the city are:

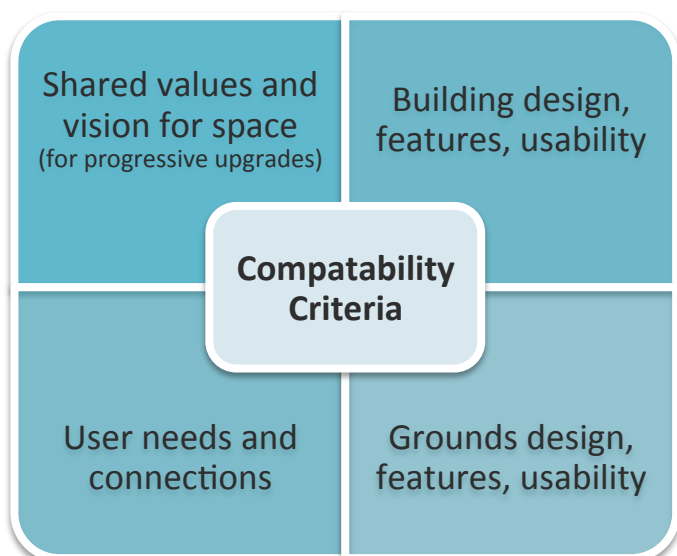
- **Local Government:** community halls, arts and sporting venues

It is generally agreed by all parties that sharing these facilities makes sense.

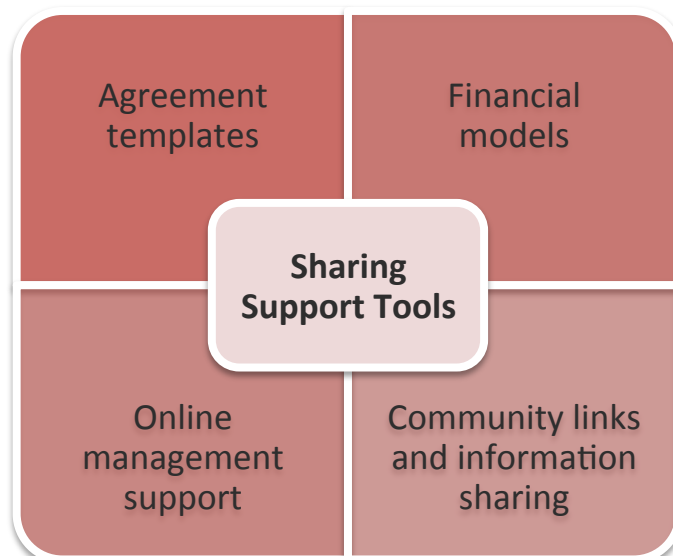
The reason it tends not to happen is because systems are not yet in place to make this easy.
